Dear all

Last month I introduced myself and told you something of my story. This time, I can offer an update on the progress towards the new Thorngate and Blackwater Benefice made up of the parishes of East Dean, East Tytherley, Lockerley, Sherfield English, Wellow and West Tytherley. The Diocese has confirmed that they will fund a priest to live in Wellow Vicarage and hope to have him or her in place before the new School Year in 2022. Work is progressing on describing what our communities and churches are like, as part of the recruitment process.

It is wonderful to see what goes on and the large number of volunteers who continue to run and support the churches. Bishop Debbie is set to meet Wellow and Sherfield English Parochial Church Councils in person on 2nd November to explain the process and the timetable, but also, most importantly, to hear any concerns there might be, before launching the formal paperwork.

St Leonard's, Sherfield English

It's reasonable to assume that when Vincent van Gogh said that, he had not been left in charge of a village church without a Vicar as Christmastide drew near and a worldwide pandemic (hopefully!) began to settle. Which of us could say what normal is any more, nor if we would return to it exactly as we have previously understood it to be? In hindsight, life pre-Covid certainly appeared to be a comfortable walk, and yet the past two years have taught us so much about how to adapt both within the church and out of it. As we enter our second month in vacancy we are again learning to adapt. We are grateful to the Reverend James Pitkin for agreeing to take our monthly Holy Communion service (on the first Sunday of each month) until the end of the year (and – we hope – beyond). This has helped us to maintain our current pattern of weekly services at 11 a.m. and to continue to provide the traditional seasonal services, which this month will include Remembrance at 10.45 a.m. on Sunday 14th (taken by the Reverend Nick Grew), and Christingle on 28th November. On Saturday 13th November we are hosting a coffee morning with a knitted display to commemorate the Second World War and Remembrance - this was postponed from VE Day 2020 but good things come to those who wait! Saturday 27th November sees our Christmas Fair and Coffee Morning from 10.30 a.m.

Meanwhile, we continue with our plans to unite with the existing benefice of Thorngate and to appoint a new assistant priest in Wellow Vicarage. This does represent a big change for the parish, placing us with five other churches in an extended benefice, and undoubtedly there are challenges. But flowers have already grown from the rocky road we have walked since the spring of 2020 and we are confident that embracing the "new normal" of a united benefice will bring shared experience and resources to help us flourish further.
