Letters from Churchwardens

St Margaret's, East with West Wellow

We expect the Diocese very soon to propose formally that Wellow Parish together with Sherfield English be merged into the Thorngate Benefice with the parishes around Lockerley. Our PCC has previously expressed its concern at these proposals and our wish that St Margaret's, Wellow, remains an independent parish.

Following recent positive discussions with the acting Archdeacon, Rev Gary Philbrick, and the Chairman of the Romsey Deanery, Sarah Boothman, the Diocese has made important concessions. These notably include the appointment of a "House for Duty Priest" to live in Wellow Vicarage with a clear responsibility for our Parish, and for the maintenance of our present pattern of services (probably with Matins returning to its former place on the 3rd Sunday rather than the 4th Sunday of the month).

These proposals will be subject to public comments in a consultation process which we expect to be announced shortly. The members of your PCC are very keen to hear your views: especially those of the congregation, but also of the wider Wellow community.

Please give this matter your careful thought and prayer, and tell me your views if you wish. We all seek to do the best for St Margaret's in the next phase of its 800 year history.

Proms at St Leonard's? Well, maybe not quite, but it is a "red alert" hot summer and the Proms are on the TV, so it had to be time for our Songs of Praise service. The church was pleasantly cool and the congregation were in triumphant voice, the sound bouncing off the rafters. All eight hymns were chosen by parishioners, who included a few words of introduction which resulted in some delightful stories about their lifelong admiration of their chosen hymn. My favourite was about the St Joseph's Catholic School for Young Ladies in Bradford, and the "young lady" being chosen for the choir just because she was the right height for the impending concert but not actually allowed to sing! St Leonard's joined in singing "Praise my soul the King of heaven" with sympathetic gusto. Fortunately, our choir does not have nearly such severe rules!

Music plays such an important part in our regular services, and we are very fortunate that our organist usually accompanies our singing. But sometimes, as we did with Songs of Praise, we use the Denon lectern for the backing tracks, technology in abundance! One hymn, though, we quietly listened to, rather than singing: "Morning has broken" was sung by a group of six 11 to 14 year-olds. The voices were clear and pure, a simple but emotional rendition of a beautiful hymn, and one we don't sing very often. (It is not in our hymn book! Shame ...)
