Very soon all of your local Churches will have had their Annual Meetings when churchwardens and members of the Parochial Church Council will have been elected. If you have been thinking about getting more involved in your local church this year, now is the time! There are bound to be new churchwardens this year.

I hope that you had a splendid Easter and even, perhaps, a Holiday. By the time you read this the Schools will be back and by the end of May it will be half-term. This year, the Church Festival of Pentecost falls on 19th May. Pentecost (also called Whit Sunday, Whitsunday or Whitsun) is a Christian holiday which takes place on the 50th day (the seventh Sunday) after Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the followers of Jesus while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1–31). It is often known as the 'Birthday' of the Church and many churches will have a Party. In the Thorngate and Blackwater Benefice Churches we are all coming together in St Leonard's Church, Sherfield English, for a service at 10.30 a.m., to be followed by a 'Bring Your Own' picnic. You are welcome to join in (or celebrate in your own Church).
